THE RULE OF LAW

This means ensuring learners have an understanding of the importance of having laws and the consequence of breaking laws, accepting that no one is above the law. The rule of law is about learners having an understanding of their rights and responsibilities not only as a learner but as employees, as citizens and consumers in society. It is about encouraging effective productive working relationships with peers, staff, and in workplace settings, employees and employers.

Individual Liberty relates to our rights and responsibilities as citizens; the right to act, believe and express oneself in a manner of one's own choosing. This requires an understanding of the balance between freedom of speech and expression and the potential negative impact on others, that is, freedom from harm.

OF THOSE WITH DIFFERENT FAITHS AND BELIEFS

Mutual respect and tolerance is about accepting that other people have different faiths or beliefs which should not be the cause of prejudicial or discriminatory behaviour. This aspect not only applies to faith and belief but, for example, to people of all backgrounds, cultures, ages, sexual orientations, genders, and abilities. Each person has the right to be treated with dignity and respect with regard to any aspect of their identity. This means that everyone should be made to feel welcome, supported and valued for who they are.

This is the belief in freedom and equality between people in which power is held by elected representatives or directly by people themselves. This means that everyone has a role in influencing decision making, at national, local and community level.
